INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the Austin History Center is to provide customers with information about the history and current events of Austin and Travis County by collecting, organizing, and preserving research materials and assisting in their use.

The collections of the Austin History Center contain valuable materials about Austin's African American communities, although there is much that remains to be documented. The materials in this bibliography are arranged by collection unit of the Austin History Center. Within each collection unit, items are arranged in shelf-list order.

This bibliography is one in a series of updates of the original 1979 bibliography. It reflects the addition of materials to the Austin History Center based on the recommendations and donations of many generous individuals and support groups. The Austin History Center card catalog supplements the online computer catalog by providing analytical entries to information in periodicals and other materials in addition to listing collection holdings by author, title, and subject. These entries, although indexing ended in the 1990s, lead to specific articles and other information in sources that would otherwise be time-consuming to find and could be easily overlooked.

There are still significant gaps remaining. See the final section of this bibliography, "Under documented Areas of Interest," for a detailed listing of topics and people about which additional material is still needed.

MICROFILM—TRAVIS COUNTY RECORDS¹

The microfilm collection includes Travis County records as well as individual monographs, periodicals, and drawings

Assessor's Abstract of City Lots (1879-1974) [also called Travis County City Lot Registers]

The most valuable records in the collection for broad use. Can be used to show how neighborhoods have changed. Arranged by lot numbers (based on the original survey). Should be used in conjunction with deeds and plat records from the county. Used prior to the current Tax Appraisal District (1980).

Assessor's Abstract of Land (surveys) (1877-1936) [also called Travis County Land Registers/T.C. Assessor's Registers]

Rural counterpart to Assessor's Abstract of City Lots.

Automobile Register (1910-1913)

Prior to 1917, counties instead of the State registered autos. Can be used as a guide to the social status of citizens.

Bond Registers (1887-1959)

Reliable guides to names of county office holders and school officials.

Chattel Mortgage Records (1877-1954)

Can be used to study material culture of this area. They are records of liens against personal property, including crop liens.

Claim Register (scattered 1907-1977)

Used prior to annual audits to list persons the county owed money. Hard to use.

Convict Labor Records (1897-1906, 1915-1916)

Prisoners contracted out by county to provide labor for private citizens. Eventually phased out.

Criminal Case Papers (1890-1941)

To use these records, one must obtain case number from indexes at the Travis County courthouse.

Inquest Records from Justices of the Peace (dates vary from court to court, range 1887 to 1977)

Records completed if circumstances of person's death were mysterious or no doctor was in attendance. Useful in studying etiology of diseases.

Justices of the Peace

Cases are listed chronologically, making it difficult to find a particular case without date of trial.

Marks and Brand Records (1840-1943)

Useful for research into cattle industry. All pre-1940 brands have been legally rendered null and void.

Oakwood Cemetery

List in alpha order the names of the interred at Oakwood, Bethany, Evergreen and the State Cemetery.

Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps

Useful search tool for locating a particular building during a particular time, tracking the development and evolution of neighborhoods in Austin, and the changes to a property over time. These maps date from the late 19th century to 1989.

Scholastic Census (1913-1970)

Bound copies of the Scholastic Census are available on the Reading Room shelves after the Dewey Decimal 900s. Serves as census information between decennial U.S. Census. Often used to establish Social Security eligibility. Although not available on microfilm, they might be in the near future.
